RTTC-Rudy Project National Time Trial Series

Stuart Dangerfield (Camel Val) trounced allcomers with an amazing show of strength and riding ability to win the Mid Devon CC-Rudy Project National Time Trial at Bovey Tracey.

He completed the arduous 30 mile course in 1-07-09, more than a minute faster than main rival Michael Hutchinson (Team MDT) who was second in 1-08-10. Dangerfied said after the event "Today is the first time I have really had to hurt myself, this has been my first big effort and it was a real test for me today" Hutchinson commented "I was baulked but then I am sure most others were".

MEMORY CORNER – EXPANDED

The following paragraph appeared in the recent edition of West Vet (The Newsletter for Veterans living in the West of England). It was taken from a longer article written by Les Pearce, Plymouth Cycling Club, for The Bicycle of 4th October 1944: -

"The recent annual hill climb club championship, promoted by the Mid-Devon Road Club for the silver cup recently presented to the club by C.A. Jackson, resulted in Tommy Ashton becoming club champion and annexing this trophy to his collection of awards. Last year's winner Ron Billings did a very creditable ride being only 12 seconds slower than Tommy." As a result of this piece we asked Tommy to give us his recollections of the day and the state of the club at the time when the Second World War was in full flow. He phoned through with the following: -

"With regard to the Hill Climb it took place up Afton Hill near Berry Pomeroy Castle and I was 16 years old in 1944. I had been in the club for 2 years by then. As well as Ron Billings other competitors I can remember were Jimmy Veale, Ron Wilkie, Pete Land and Ron Wood – (Ron denies this saying he had more sense than try and defy gravity on such a steep hill). The winning time was about 2 minutes 40 seconds. It is not likely that Geoff Tewson rode, as he would have been too young.

The club was made up of three groups. They were the young (from Teignmouth Grammer School), the infirm who had been discharged or excused from military duty and the elderly. Quite a number worked at the Newton Abbot Co-op or in Western and Bulpin's Garages.

Having joined the club in 1942 my first race was a 10 on the road between Torquay and Newton Abbot. It was won with a time around 30 minutes. Runner up was Alan Sharp about 1 minute slower and I came in after 33.5 minutes on the road. Ivor Hatton was last but then he never got the hang of racing.

King of the road in Devon was Les Deem from Devonport who was winning open races with times in the 1 hour 11 to 12 minute range. In early August Harold Broom organised a club ride to Pangbourne Lane, between Reading and Newbury to see the classic Bath Road 100 mile Time Trial. The lads rode there laden down with spare clothes and food etc. Harold went up by train and then rode back with them.

Winner of the Bath Road 100 was Arch Harding of the Middlesex Road Club. Today's coaches would not have approved of his methods. Arch would arrive at the start line puffing on a cigarette. The pusher of would hold him up and after one last drag he would extinguish the fag on his stem and hand the stub end to the pusher off to dispose of. On the day in question Arch rocketed around the course in 4 hours 28 minutes – a startling time for those days.

Having seen the rides done and the roads in the Thames Valley a racing trip was called for so off I went to ride in the Berks and Oxford 25 mile TT. The result was a time of 1 hour 10 minutes 8 seconds. This was many minutes better than anything done in Devon. From then on I was a marked man and was having to ride off scratch in all open events."
